Conus lobitensis Kaicher, 1977



Lectotype USNM

Kaicher believed erroneously that Paes da Franca had described the shell. Initially the Kaicher cards were regarded as invalid descriptions. However, a decision by ICZN confirmed their validity. *C. lobitensis* is now accepted in Worms as a valid species.

The Kaicher description is short: "White with a very distinctive dark brown pattern; to approx 20mm"

Rosenberg & Petit, 2003 designated the type locality as Armado Bay, Moçamedes, Angola based on the original label from Ed Petuch collection. No such locality is recognisable. Perhaps it is a reference to Chapeu Armado, Namibe

The species is similar to C. *fuscolineatus* but with shorter spiral lines and a lighter aperture. *C. lobitensis* has been treated in several publications as a synonym of *C. fuscolineatus*. Specimens are shown under the name *C. fuscolineatus* in Monnier et al, 2018
